

## SAC Meeting Minutes

## April $5^{\text {th }}, 2023$

6:00-7:00 pm

In Attendance: Veronica Singer, Darci McCabe, Nicky Smith, Michelle Singer, Moira Peters, Kristyn Thoms, Jocelyn Paige. Sheila Campbell and Melanda Greene joined later on in the meeting.

Welcome \& Call to Order: Nicky Smith called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m.
Review/Approval of Agenda: Veronica approved the Agenda.
Review/Approval of Minutes: Moira approved the Minutes.

## Business Arising From Minutes:

- Moira asks for more information on how emotional needs are being supported within the school, and what resources are available for parents both within the school and community.
- Millie explained how tier-2 supports are in place, friendship groups have been formed, focused on expressing emotions and dealing with conflict.
- Veronica Singer continues to be the social emotional support within the school and explains that NS Department of Health has lots of resources available.


## Principals Report:

- The winter carnival was a great success. There was great participation in the planned themed days, and the puppet making workshop and performance by the Maritime Marionettes was well received.
- The school dance was a huge hit, with great attendance
- All CDS students received a t-shirt with CDS logo
- The school mascot visited during spirit day. Special thanks for Nicky Smith for capturing photos.
- Professional Developemnt on Culturally Responsive Pedagogy continues
- The SFNP (School Food \& Nutrition Policy) grant that was received for purchasing culturally diverse food was spent. This was a great learning experience and was enjoyed by all.
- A new Grade 1 student joined the school after March break, bringing our enrollment from Pre-Primary - Grade 6 p to 71 students.
- Our IT Support Specialist was in the school this month setting up new chrome books carts. There is one located upstairs, and one downstairs.
- SLP support has been to the school on March $7^{\text {th }}$ to do screeners with students, and further follow-up will continue with a caseload.
- Hot lunch was provided, free of cost for students on March $9^{\text {th }}$. Pizza was ordered from Sammy's. The next free hot lunch will be served April $14^{\text {th }}$ and consist of hot chicken burgers and fruit smoothies. Special thank you to Sheila Campbell and Kanchana Thompson for preparing this for the students.
- Report cards were distributed electronically on March $28^{\text {th }}$ to parents/guardians. Parent teacher was held the evening of March $30^{\text {th }}$ and the morning of March $31^{\text {st }}$.
- Veronica Singer (Social Emotional Learning Suport) along with Sara Landry (Community Outreach Support Worker) and Keira Dacey (Child \& Youth Care Practioner) both from SchoolsPlus continue to support students in our building.
- Literacy continues to be a school-wide focus; particularly phonological and phonemic awareness. Andrew Francis (Coordinator of Literacy Innovation and Special Projects) visited with our teachers March 10th. He will be returning on April $25^{\text {th }}$ to model a lesson using the UFLI manual.
- MathUP Leadership continues at CDS. On March $31^{\text {st }}$, teachers attended a PD session at Kennetcook District for the 3 local schools involved in this. Focus included the different meanings of subtraction and how cuisenaire rods can be used to model this. A school set of cuisenaire rods have been ordered.
- Work Orders have been put in to put together the new soccer nets, and the gaga ball pit.
- Covid test kits and masks are available for students. Let the office know.
- The March monthly assembly was held March 29th. Our next monthly assembly will be April 28th.
- After School Technology Intramurals begins April $5^{\text {th }}$. It will alternate each Wednesday between grades P-3 and 4-6 until May $24^{\text {th }}$.
- After School Running Club is set to start April $27^{\text {th }}$ and go until June $1^{\text {st. }}$. This is open to all students in grades P-6 and is to promote physical fitness.


## School Improvement Plan Update:

- Math Mentor comes in Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday to support teachers


## New Business/Public Input:

- PD was a great experience for the teachers. The focus was on MathUp. The teachers enjoyed seeing and bouncing ideas off other teachers at the same grade level.
- MathUp only has 2 Grade levels, and not 3 Grade levels. For our 3 grade classrooms. There was talk about creating balance in the classrooms.
- Kristyn asked for more information on whether our current three-grade classrooms will return to a two-classroom split in the future. There seems to be an obvious disadvantage to both the students and teaching staff because of these 3 Grade classrooms. Extensive discussion followed this question, and the SAC members agree that we should take some form of action to address this.
- Moira has volunteered to draft a letter from the SAC group and will email correspond with the SAC members to follow-up.
- Nicky also mentions that there was a previous letter sent in the past and will have a look and share this with the group as well. There was no response back after the last letter attempt.
- The SAC has $\$ 3343.96$ to spend by the end of the school year.
